

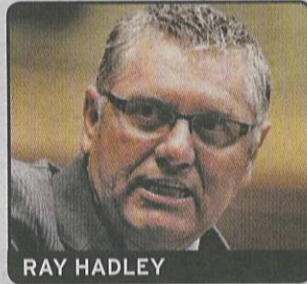

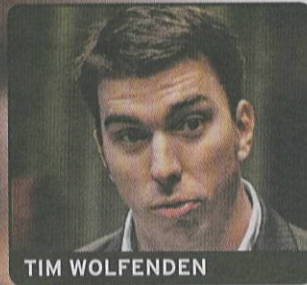

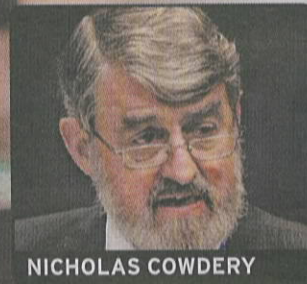

BARRY O'Farrell took inspiration from yesterday's People's Parliament, pledging to bring on urgency motion debates in Parliament if 10,000 signatures are gathered on any issue.

"An ongoing people's Parliament should address issues that citizens believe are important, rather than those that are convenient for the government," Mr O'Farrell said.

Mr O'Farrell, who is expected to be elected premier in less than four weeks, also gave the Parliament its

first victory, saying he supported a motion which would lead to people donating organs.

Under the proposal passed today, there would be a requirement for organs to be donated unless people specifically voted against it in The People's Parliament or a motion to block the ability of a minister to veto an organ donation.

The resolution came after the Parliament heard from transplant recipient Jessica Sparks, 47, who said: "I had a double lung transplant 18 months ago. I wouldn't have it without it."

St Vincent's Hospital executive director Gordon Fulde said he was proud to have a patient on life support who was the victim of an alcohol-related attack and his family was
